Hochstetter's butterfly-orchid

Platanthera azorica Schltr.

DESCRIPTION

Plant with a height of 10 - 20 (35) cm; 2 (1) large basal leaves, oblong-lanceolate; 2 to 4 stem leaves. Yellowish-green flowers, 10 to 25; lateral sepals oval-lanceolate, sometimes arranged nearly horizontally. Linear-lanceolate labellum, strongly reflexed; spur measuring 1.8 to 9.5 mm in length.

HABITAT

Altitude meadows, low shrublands of *Erica* and *Calluna* and roadsides with remnants of native vegetation.





DISTRIBUTION

Plant endemic to the Azores Archipelago, Portugal, currently it can be found only on Sao Jorge and Faial islands.

THREATS

Habitat loss due to pasture creation and planting of exotic species like the Himalayan *Hedychium gardnerianum*, the Australian *Pittosporum undulatum*, and the American *Lantana camara*. Tourism and plant collection are also threats.
