Red helleborine

Cephalanthera rubra (L.) L.C.M Rich.

DESCRIPTION

Grows from 20 to 50 cm high with often just a few but up to 20 quite large red flowers. The acute petals spread like wings so that the flowers remind the silhouette of tiny flying birds.

HABITAT

Calcareous, sparse deciduous forests.

DISTRIBUTION

Northern Africa, southern, central and northern Europe, eastward to Caucasus and Urals.



THREATS

Unfavorable forest management leading to darker and less species-rich forests.
